Activity

Put Peter in Order

What You Need:

Six index cards (or small pieces of paper),
writing utensil

What You Do:

Write down the following events on the
cards (one event per card). (These events
are listed in the order they occurred.)

- Peter in prison, believers praying
- Peter asleep, angel awakening him
- Peter's chains fall off
- Peter walks past guards and out
the gate
- Peter at the door, talking to Rhoda
- Peter talking to amazed believers

Now mix up the events so they're out of
order. Then lay the cards side-by-side on
a flat surface.

Invite your child to play a game with
you. Say, "Each of these cards has a
scene from our Bible story written on
it. Let's read them together. (*Read the
cards with your child, but keep them out of
order.*) As you can see, the scenes are out
of order. Can you try to put them back in
the correct order?" (*Use Acts 12:1-19 as a
reference, if needed.*)

When the events are in the correct order,
say, "WOW! Peter was STUCK in prison.
But God sent an angel to set him free!
And you know what? God is with us when
we feel stuck, too."

Talk About the Bible Story

If you had been Peter before the angel arrived,
how would you have felt?

Have you ever gotten stuck somewhere
physically? How did that feel?

Do you ever feel stuck on a math problem or
some other type of question at school? How
does that feel?

When you feel stuck in a situation you want to get
out of, how can you rely on God like Peter did?

What can you do the next time you feel stuck?

*Parent: Talk about a time when you felt stuck, and
how God helped you through that situation.*

Prayer
